Thanks and Comments from the VP

Dear Friends:

I would like to share some thoughts with you. First, I want to thank those members who voted for me. I will persist in our common effort to improve our club.

During the end-of-season long range planning committee meeting on 27 April, a number of improvement plans were discussed. Among these were the ongoing 2nd floor ladies bathroom renovation and the revamping of the far basement room, i.e., the area where the ski rack is located.

These large and potentially expensive, undertakings seem to suffer two common problems: money and people power. The assignment of "project managers" was presented as a way to shepherd a plan to fruition. Bob Hener, our now past president, stepped up to oversee the bath project. I will continue with the lodge heating project.

These project managers will work in concert with Curtis Casey, our Maintenance Chair, while at the same time, removing considerable weight from his ongoing agenda.

Project funding is always a serious consideration.

How do we best balance member expectations and desires against the allocation of funds? We can't have everything and still be affordable to members, especially those with children.

At the last board meeting, May 10, Walter, lead a discussion on getting wider member participation to "work" for the club. The ensuing discussion centered on the fact that member participation in actual work has declined over the years. We can always hire the talent, but this is getting expensive, even in Vermont.

The feeling at the board level is that the club needs to get all members, not just the usual suspects, to contribute. This could be done not only during the scheduled work weekends, as now, but in small groups—ad hoc work parties—during the off season. This option this would give members more flexibility to contribute.




