40 Years Ago - May 1965

An assessment of \$10 for singles and \$15 for families was passed to cover the cost of club social activities and rental of rooms for club meetings. Alan Silberman reported seeing Jackie Kennedy coming down a slope at Stratton with an instructor.

The Executive Director of the USEASA responded to a concern about skis being stolen. He recommended that as an industry we should engrave a permanent ID number on each new ski and record name and address of the owner. He was hoping, by using "IBM Processing," that some kind of system could be functioning for the 65–66 season. I wonder if he is still working on it.

In six major Connecticut races the River Hills Ski Team compiled a record of 3 first places, 2 second places and 1 fifth place. A good record.

30 Years Ago - May 1975

Orie Mesedahl, who recently passed away, was the first KEN VOUGHT award recipient at the Annual Spring Dance. Carol Bancroft initiated the award and was Chairperson of the first selection committee consisting of Claire Deluca, Eleanor Jensen Gilbert, Herb Rudolf and Ed Pierce. Carol described the award recipient as a person who "demonstrated selfless dedication to the club and its members." A photo of Ken is hanging in the Lodge.

20 Years Ago - May 1985

Jerry Schorr announced a twoweek ski trip to the Three Valleys in France between Courchevel and Val Thorens at a cost between \$1450 and \$1500. In only twenty years the cost has doubled.

Denis Szokolay won the gold medal for the down hill competition in the US Masters Alpine Championship for skiers 65 and older. He covered the 1.1 mile course in 1:19 averaging about 55 mph. Can any of us seniors match him today?

10 Years Ago -1995

The Skizette reprinted a Stamford Advocate photo of Charlie Taft showing off his homegrown 138-lb pumpkin to his neighbor five year old Matthew Kellick. Another photo caught Maintenance Chairman Curtis Casey supervising a group of members laying the flagstone entrance walkway to the Lodge. Curtis has just repeated another term as 2004–05 Maintenance Chairperson.


Lakes of the Clouds Hut


