
From the Larchmont Yacht Club Mainsheet

Anthony Huston won the 2006 International One-Design Worlds on September 15th. A week earlier, sailing in a World Championship -let alone winning the regatta - was the farthest thing from his mind. Having lost a hard-fought qualifying battle to fellow Long Island Sound local James D. Bishop, Jr. of American Yacht Club, Huston was resigned to concentrate on tuning the IOD fleet so that every boat would be even. The IOD championships are distinctive in that sailors rotate through locally borrowed boats for each race. Local fleets vary in size and invite as many competitors as they can accommodate.

On Sunday, September 10th Hurricane Florence slammed into Bermuda closing the airport and grounding defending champion Penny Simmons. With 10 boats ready to race but only nine competitors, Huston got the offer to put a crew together and race after the second largest fleet, Nantucket declined due to time pressure.

Having only a few hours to put together a team, Tony enlisted fellow Larchmont YC members Jon Singsen (tactics) and Marion Maneker (bow), with Huston's stalwart crew of Chris Zimmerman and Dan Jennings on cockpit and sail trim. "Wednesday was the crucial day as we had 4 races in varied breeze and direction. As we were subbing in for two of the crew that had to work, it was quite a new tactic to have everyone introduce themselves as we reached to the starting line." Kin Yellot of Nantucket and Tom Tracey of J-44 Gold Digger fame were rotated in to help Huston solidify his hold on second place.

Long Island Sound produced a wide range of conditions for the regatta. The first day of racing was called after the practice race when 3-5 foot seas and a gusty Easterly broke a boom and tore a few spinnakers. Tuesday and Wednesday brought ideal flat-water racing and Southerlies ranging from 5 to 15 knots. Solid finishes in the top of the fleet allowed Huston to pull into first place on the penultimate day. David Rockefeller of Northeast Harbor had more first places (3 versus

Huston's 1) but a tight fleet and remarkably well-matched boats rewarded consistency above all.

Going into the final race, Huston had a five-point lead on Rockefeller but three other sailors were within one or two points of second place, including Jim Bishop Jr. and 9-time Champion Bill Widnall of Marblehead. The final race was sailed in 3-5 foot seas and another gear crunching lumpy Easterly. Despite his lead, Huston started aggressively-too aggressively-and the final race began with leader OCS and the regatta up for grabs.

The masterful combination of Huston's ability to slide through the boat-stopping waves and Singsen's tactics quickly put the team back in contention, rounding third at the weather mark. While Huston's beloved Aileen (Cornelius Shields' original IOD built in 1936) won the final race for the Bermuda team, the local boys locked up the championship and the first time the Long Island Sound fleet has won the IOD Worlds since 1987.

Huston said, "Playing this game is a true privilege and I am grateful for everyday I get the chance. My crew was stellar and I am extremely pleased that Larchmont has the world championship team for our fleet's 70th birthday."

Congratulations to Huston and his crew for bringing the IOD Championship back to LYC.


Marie made it easy for me to enjoy our club, hosting board meetings, attending our functions and supporting me as a board member and your president.
